A few words from Fr Joe.....

Last Sunday evening in Donnybrook Church, Archbishop Farrell welcomed 45 people who have recently completed the year-long diocesan course in Catechesis. He spoke warmly about their generosity in taking the time to learn and their goodwill on the journey of faith to walk with the church in a new way. He didn't specifically reference Bod Dylan but the song 'The Times They Are A-Changin' could have played as the backing track to his words.

He is a man who calls it as he sees it, at one point, speaking of the rapid change in attitudes and church practice he said "The real journey confronts us with something new, but something we clearly do not understand. We feel perplexed, even that the Lord has abandoned us. We feel that we have lost our way." Sometimes those sentiments describe exactly how I feel. I just cannot fathom how the Lord, who dwells in all the baptised, doesn't seem to be able to make that presence felt, or illicit a faith response in his people in a familiar way that would draw us all together as a living church. I've always felt that faith is something deep inside each of us, being called into action as we grow and make the journey and that we are better together, joined as a family of faith around the altar and celebrating the sacraments. But others clearly don't see it that way, and at best offer to be a 'good' person with 'Christian' values and a direct connection to God that doesn't need a priest, a guide, a teacher or companions.

Almost all of us who come to Church have been accompanied since our earliest childhood by parents who practiced their faith, schools that formed our faith and priests to preside at faith filled moments. We didn't need, or expect, or often see any other lay men and woman in leadership roles influencing our living faith. Well that's now something that we need urgently. We have so many in our community, like the 45 in Donnybrook, who only need a little bit of help, to guide, teach, form and inspire the next generations. This is lay ministry, we need it now and we have to believe it is the very way that Jesus is calling his followers to action. He is calling you!
