

A few words from Fr Joe

I sat in the car one day during the week, mesmerised by a young dad, with his little lad, putting up lights in their hedge. I can honestly say that this is not something I remember from my childhood, but it was lovely to watch them working together in the bitter cold afternoon, transforming their property into a winter wonderland. Homes all around the parish are now wearing their Christmas lights inside and out and what a difference it makes. This is yet another sign that we are living towards Christmas, with hope in our hearts, joy in our lives and trust in the power of love.

I've been lighting the candles on my Advent wreath each morning and evening and making a special effort to have some prayer time with Advent readings and themes. It is one to way to live with the signs of Christmas all around us, while we wait for the Nativity and draw strength from anticipation of what is to come, and to make mind and body ready to welcome the child of Bethlehem.
