A few words from Fr Joe

I was praying with Gospel passage Matthew 1:18-24 recently, which as you know tells the story of the Angel coming to St Joseph in his dreams, and assuring him of God's plan for Mary, who has conceived by the Holy Spirit and asks him to name the child, Jesus, because he is the one who is to save the world. We have all entered deeply into the nativity story during the days of Christmas and are brought back to the simple, enduring truth of our faith, that God so loved the world that he sent his only Son, to be our Lord and Master.

Every time we celebrate Christmas we renew a relationship of love which supports and guides every step of our life journey. We are disciples of this one Lord and we are brothers and sisters in this family of faith.

The church is born too out of Love and founded on Peter, a sometimes weak and unfaithful servant, but one who believed in the call to follow Jesus and accepted the role that was entrusted to him.

This is a Jubilee Year in the life of the Church and we meet it under the banner of "Pilgrims of Hope". Pope Francis asks us to walk together in a spirit of renewal, hope and charity and to be ready to embrace our faith, find the Lord's call individually and as a community.

Like St Joseph we are allowed to dream a little! My dream is that there would be a new energy in the life of the Church, that the parish would become ever more a part of the lives of the baptised faithful and that the liturgy, prayer and service would be embraced fully and transform our lives. The realist in me sees that this will happen in the context of a decline in numbers, a reduction in services and the closing of some of our parishes in Dublin. We trust in the Spirit of God to sow the seed while we sleep and awaken us ready for action, and sustain us in the year ahead.
